The Jelly Bean Prayer


A lovely Gift & a great way to explain Jesus' death, burial and resurrection to your Grandchildren

Directions:

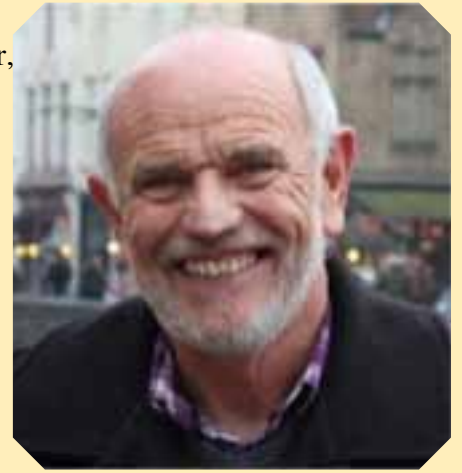

We are blessed and delighted to welcome Phil Butcher

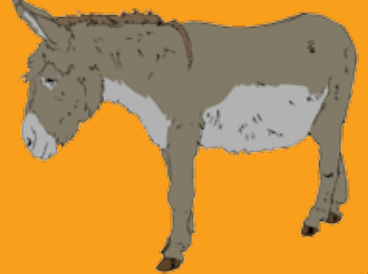
