





We're delighted to share with you these beautiful pictures of last year's *Childrens'*Stations of the Cross sponsored by our Ministry for Grandparents at Prince of Peace in Houston, Texas. They are but one example of what our wonderful Ministries provide to families in parishes worldwide all year long.

Our **Children's Stations** have grown each year and with adding Lent and Holy Week activities for the children last year; we're hopeful that even more families will attend this year.

We also take the opportunity to ask Grandparents and parents to write the names of their grandchildren and children in our *Prayer Journal* so that we can pray for them at each of our Ministry meetings. A young mother approached us once saying, "My children have no Grandparents, I would love for you to pray for them."

"The Way of the Cross for Kids" produced by EWTN is an animated 30 minute program which explains the Stations in a way children can understand as well as introducing lessons on being helpful, kindness, etc. It's available in English and Spanish and can be ordered (\$10) through EWTN's Religious Catalogue. Inexpensive Lenten activities can be ordered through Oriental Trading and elsewhere.

This program is so appreciated and loved by all. We're not quite sure who enjoys it more, the children or us Grandparents. What we all know is that it's the epitome of

what we're all about as an Apostolate – passing on our faith and keeping prayer at the heart of family life.







New study asks why kids stay Catholic

As about 15% of U.S. adults who were raised Catholic said they had remained practicing Catholics attending weekly Mass into adulthood, researchers at Georgetown University's Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate and the Peyton Institute for Domestic Church Life conducted a study to examine commonalities in families with children who remained Catholic as adults. The study found participants from these families generally described their households as "warmer and more affectionate than the average family," with "very good communication," listening to questions and concerns, rituals of meals eaten together and faith-filled family routines. Participants emphasized the importance of weekly Mass attendance and nearly all participants reported doing service work and giving to charity.





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


